1. A request from Jim Burke to repair the Weiss Cottage roof in the amount of \$3,725.00. This will be reported to Traveler's Insurance for reimbursement due to the tornado damage.
2. A request from Jason Zinsmeister to have the City of Cullman apply for grants to fund the carving of the trees from the tornado damage. Buchanan Jackson, Cullman County Economic Office, said some funds may be available from the Council of the Arts. Mr. Jackson wants to know what size of project and if all Cullman City Council Members are in favor of the project before he invests time and money into project.
3. Police Chief Culpepper and Fire Chief Reinhardt request the Council authorize the Mayor to sign a letter, that is due by June 24th, 2011, to proceed with the grant application for storm shelters. The grant would provide for 75% funding with a 25% local match, but in-kind services are allowed toward this match. The City of Cullman's matching funds is estimated to be between \$350,000 to \$400,000.
4. Cullman County Commission request a work order for the Road Department to proceed with the work on Eva Road Bridge.
5. A request for contract review of the Design Team for Downtown Redevelopment Project, headed by The Walker Collaborative, F&O Architects and Leonard Design Architects.
6. The Clean Sweep Program ends on June 12, 2011 for private property owners. The extension until July 12, 2011 must be approved by the Cullman City Council. The Corps of Engineers can

not go onto property not declared by FEMA.
